Based on these 25 survey questions, the Loris FBC Evangelism & Discipleship Committee recommends using the resources provided for each question as part of your "Individual Discipleship Plan" (IDP) to help you grow in your knowledge of Biblical Doctrine (Philippians 1:9; Colossians 1:9-10; 1Timothy 4:16; 2Timothy 4:3) as well as Spiritual Maturity (Ephesians 4:11-13; 2Peter 1:5-10).

If you are not sure about the correct "Biblical" truth of any of these 25 questions:

- 1) Look up the Bible verses provided as the basis to know the truth for each question;
- 2) Review some or all of the other resources recommended by the Evangelism & Discipleship Committee to help reinforce your understanding of the truth for each question; and
- 3) Discuss with your mentor any of these questions that you may still need more help with to understand the "Biblical" truth of those questions.

1. The Bible is the word of God, perfect as it was originally written.

1 Thessalonians 2:13 (NIV)

13 "And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is at work in you who believe."

Matthew 4:4 (NIV)

4 Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'"

Southern Baptist Faith & Message Article IV: "Salvation"

Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man, and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. In its broadest sense salvation includes regeneration, justification, sanctification, and glorification. There is no salvation apart from personal faith in Jesus Christ as Lord.

A. Regeneration, or the new birth, is a work of God's grace whereby believers become new creatures in Christ Jesus. It is a change of heart wrought by the Holy Spirit through conviction of sin, to which the sinner responds in repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Repentance and faith are inseparable experiences of grace.

Repentance is a genuine turning from sin toward God. Faith is the acceptance of Jesus Christ and commitment of the entire personality to Him as Lord and Saviour.

- B. Justification is God's gracious and full acquittal upon principles of His righteousness of all sinners who repent and believe in Christ .Justification brings the believer unto a relationship of peace and favor with God.
- C. Sanctification is the experience, beginning in regeneration, by which the believer is set apart to God's purposes, and is enabled to progress toward moral and spiritual maturity through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in him. Growth in grace should continue throughout the regenerate person's life.
- D. Glorification is the culmination of salvation and is the final blessed and abiding state of the redeemed.

Southern Baptist Faith and Message Article III: "Man"

Man is the special creation of God, made in His own image. He created them male and female as the crowning work of His creation. The gift of gender is thus part of the goodness of God's creation. In the beginning man was innocent of sin and was endowed by his Creator with freedom of choice. By his free choice man sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. Through the temptation of Satan, man transgressed the command of God, and fell from his original innocence whereby his posterity inherit a nature and an environment inclined toward sin. Therefore, as soon as they are capable of moral action, they become transgressors and are under condemnation. Only the grace of God can bring man into His holy fellowship and enable man to fulfill the creative purpose of God. The sacredness of human personality is evident in that God created man in His own image, and in that Christ died for man; therefore, every person of every race possesses full dignity and is worthy of respect and Christian love.

5. God is three persons in one: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

Southern Baptist Faith & Message Article II. "God"

There is one and only one living and true God. He is an intelligent, spiritual, and personal Being, the Creator, Redeemer, Preserver, and Ruler of the universe. God is infinite in holiness and all other perfections. God is all powerful and all knowing; and His perfect knowledge extends to all things, past, present, and future, including the future decisions of His free creatures. To Him we owe the highest love, reverence, and obedience. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being.

A. God the Father

God as Father reigns with providential care over His universe, His creatures, and the flow of the stream of human history according to the purposes of His grace. He is all powerful, all knowing, all loving, and all wise. God is Father in truth to those who become children of God through faith in Jesus Christ. He is fatherly in His attitude toward all men.

B. God the Son

Christ is the eternal Son of God. In His incarnation as Jesus Christ He was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. Jesus perfectly revealed and did the will of God, taking upon Himself human nature with its demands and necessities and identifying Himself completely with mankind yet without sin. He honored the divine law by His personal obedience, and in His substitutionary death on the cross He made provision for the redemption of men from sin. He was raised from the dead with a glorified body and appeared to His disciples as the person who was with them before His crucifixion. He ascended into heaven and is now exalted at the right hand of God where He is the One Mediator, fully God, fully man, in whose Person is effected the reconciliation between God and man. He will return in power and glory to judge the world and to consummate His redemptive mission. He now dwells in all believers as the living and ever present Lord.

C. God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God, fully divine. He inspired holy men of old to write the Scriptures. Through illumination He enables men to understand truth. He exalts Christ. He convicts men of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. He calls men to the Saviour, and effects regeneration. At the moment of regeneration He baptizes every believer into the Body of Christ. He cultivates Christian character, comforts believers, and bestows the spiritual gifts by which they serve God through His church. He seals the believer unto the day of final redemption. His presence in the Christian is the guarantee that God will bring the believer into the fullness of the stature of Christ. He enlightens and empowers the believer and the church in worship, evangelism, and service.

- 7 Who then is like me? Let him proclaim it. Let him declare and lay out before me what has happened since I established my ancient people, and what is yet to come-- yes, let him foretell what will come.
- 8 Do not tremble, do not be afraid. Did I not proclaim this and foretell it long ago? You are my witnesses. <u>Is there any God besides me? No, there is no other Rock; I know not one.</u>"
- 9 All who make idols are nothing, and the things they treasure are worthless. Those who would speak up for them are blind; they are ignorant, to their own shame.

John 14:6 (NIV) "Jesus answered, 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

John 3:16-18 (NIV)

- 16 "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.
- 17 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.
- 18 Whoever believes in him is not condemned, <u>but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son</u>.

Matthew 5:21-22 (NIV)

- 21 "You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.'
- 22 But I tell you that anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment. Again, anyone who says to his brother, 'Raca,' is answerable to the Sanhedrin. But anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell.

10. Jesus Christ was fully man and fully God from His virgin birth until His death on the cross.

PROOF 1: Both Jesus' virgin birth and His "deity" are proclaimed in the verse:

Isaiah 7:14 "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: <u>The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son</u>, and will call Him IMMANUEL." (NOTE: The name "Immanuel" means "God with us"!)

PROOF 2: The fact that Jesus was born to be a "human" son, while at the same time remain "deity" as a member of the Godhead, is confirmed in the verse:

Isaiah 9:6 "For to us <u>A CHILD IS BORN</u>, to us A SON IS GIVEN, and the government will be on His shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, <u>MIGHTY GOD</u>, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

PROOF 3: On the human side, Jesus had a beginning and was conceived by the Holy Spirit and was born of the Virgin Mary. On the divine side, He had no beginning because He was from all eternity:

Isaiah 9:6 "For unto us a child is born (i.e. "beginning of His humanity"), unto us a Son is given (i.e. the Son already existed in His divinity before He was born!)."

Galatians 4:4 "But when the time had fully come, God sent His Son (i.e. the divine being), born of a woman (i.e. becoming a human being), born under law..."

PROOF 4: He was "eternally preexistent" (always existing, even before the visible universe began):

John 1:1-3, 14 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through Him all things were made; WITHOUT HIM NOTHING WAS MADE THAT HAS BEEN MADE... The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, THE GLORY OF THE ONE AND ONLY, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth."

John 8:56-59a "'Your father Abraham rejoiced at the thought of seeing my day; HE SAW IT AND WAS GLAD.' 'You are not yet fifty years old,' the Jews said to Him, 'and You have seen Abraham!' 'I tell you the truth,' Jesus answered, '<u>BEFORE ABRAHAM WAS BORN, I AM!</u>' At this, they picked up stones to stone Him, but Jesus hid Himself…"

1Peter 1:20 "He (i.e. Jesus) was <u>FOREKNOWN BEFORE THE CREATION OF THE WORLD</u>, but was revealed in these last times for your sake."

PROOF 5: He was entirely SINLESS in His human life and no normally born man is sinless (Romans 5:12):

2Corinthians 5:21 "God made Him (i.e. Jesus) <u>WHO HAD NO SIN</u> to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God."

Hebrews 4:14-15 "Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—YET WAS WITHOUT SIN."

Southern Baptist Faith & Message Article II. "God"

There is one and only one living and true God. He is an intelligent, spiritual, and personal Being, the Creator, Redeemer, Preserver, and Ruler of the universe. God is infinite in holiness and all other perfections. God is all powerful and all knowing; and His perfect knowledge extends to all things, past, present, and future, including the future decisions of His free creatures. To Him we owe the highest love, reverence, and obedience. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being.

Christ is the eternal Son of God. In His incarnation as Jesus Christ He was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. Jesus perfectly revealed and did the will of God, taking upon Himself human nature with its demands and necessities and identifying Himself completely with mankind yet without sin. He honored the divine law by His personal obedience, and in His substitutionary death on the cross He made provision for the redemption of men from sin. He was raised from the dead with a glorified body and appeared to His disciples as the person who was with them before His crucifixion. He ascended into heaven and is now exalted at the right hand of God where He is the One Mediator, fully God, fully man, in whose Person is effected the reconciliation between God and man. He will return in power and glory to judge the world and to consummate His redemptive mission. He now dwells in all believers as the living and ever present Lord.

SCIENCE CONFIRMS HUMAN LIFE BEGINS AT CONCEPTION:

The science of embryology establishes that from the earliest stages of development, the unborn are distinct, living and whole human beings. They are distinct. (Meaning they are not part of another human being.) They are living. (Dead things don't grow!) And they are whole. (Sure, they have yet to grow and mature, but the kind of thing they are is not in question.) Human parents produce human offspring.

Leading embryology textbooks affirm this. For example, in The Developing Human: Clinically Oriented Embryology, Keith L. Moore and T.V.N. Persaud write: "A zygote is the beginning of a new human being. Human development begins at fertilization, the process during which a male gamete or sperm ... unites with a female gamete or oocyte ... to form a single cell called a zygote. This highly specialized, totipotent cell marks the beginning of each of us as a unique individual."

T.W. Sadler's Langman's Embryology states that the development of a human begins with fertilization, in which the male sperm and the female oocyte "unite to give rise to a new organism, the zygote."

Embryologists Ronan O'Rahilly and Fabiola Müller write, "Although life is a continuous process, fertilization is a critical landmark because, under ordinary circumstances, a new, genetically distinct human organism is thereby formed."

Psalm 139:13-16 "For You created MY inmost being; <u>you knit ME together IN MY MOTHER'S WOMB</u>. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place. When I was woven together in the depths of the earth, <u>YOUR EYES SAW MY UNFORMED BODY...</u>"

Exodus 21:22-23 "If men who are fighting hit A PREGNANT WOMAN and she gives birth prematurely but there is no serious injury, the offender must be fined whatever the woman's husband demands and the court allows. But if there is serious injury, you are to take <u>LIFE FOR LIFE</u>..."

Proverbs 31:8-9 "SPEAK UP for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute. Speak up and judge fairly; DEFEND THE RIGHTS OF THE POOR AND NEEDY."

Proverbs 24:10-12 "<u>RESCUE THOSE BEING LED AWAY TO DEATH</u>; hold back those staggering toward slaughter. If you say, 'But we knew nothing about this', does not he who weighs the heart perceive it? Does not He who guards YOUR LIFE know it? Will he not repay each person ACCORDING TO WHAT HE HAS DONE?"

Matthew 16:18 (NIV)

18 And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.

- 23 Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful.
- 24 And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds.
- 25 <u>Let us not give up meeting together</u>, as some are in the habit of doing, <u>but let us encourage one another</u>--and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

1 Corinthians 12:12-28 (NIV)

- 12 The body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts; and though all its parts are many, they form one body. So it is with Christ.
- 13 For we were all baptized by one Spirit into one body--whether Jews or Greeks, slave or free--and we were all given the one Spirit to drink.
- 14 Now the body is not made up of one part but of many.
- 15 If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason cease to be part of the body.
- 16 And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason cease to be part of the body.
- 17 If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be?
- 18 But in fact God has arranged the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be.
- 19 If they were all one part, where would the body be?
- 20 As it is, there are many parts, but one body.
- 21 The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!"
- 22 On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable,
- 23 and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty,
- 24 while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has combined the members of the body and has given greater honor to the parts that lacked it,
- 25 so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other.
- 26 If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.
- 27 Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.
- 28 And in the church God has appointed first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then workers of miracles, also those having gifts of healing, those able to help others, those with gifts of administration, and those speaking in different kinds of tongues.

1 Corinthians 14:26 (NIV)

26 What then shall we say, brothers? When you come together, everyone has a hymn, or a word of instruction, a revelation, a tongue or an interpretation. All of these must be done for the strengthening of the church.

Ephesians 3:10-11 (NIV)

- 10 His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms,
- 11 according to his eternal purpose which he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Colossians 1:24 (NIV)

24 Now I rejoice in what was suffered for you, and I fill up in my flesh what is still lacking in regard to Christ's afflictions, <u>for the sake of his body</u>, which is the church.

1 Timothy 3:15 (NIV)

15 if I am delayed, <u>you will know how people ought to conduct themselves in God's household, which is the church</u> of the living God, the pillar and foundation of the truth.

James 5:14 (NIV)

14 Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord.

Southern Baptist Faith & Message Article VI: The Church

A New Testament church of the Lord Jesus Christ is an autonomous local congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the two ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws, exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word, and seeking to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth. Each congregation operates under the Lordship of Christ through democratic processes. In such a congregation each member is responsible and accountable to Christ as Lord. - 19 Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God.
- 20 Therefore no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin.
- 21 But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify.
- 22 This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference,
- 23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,
- 24 and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus.

Romans 5:1-2 (NIV)

- ¹ Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,
- ² through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand..."

Romans 6:23 (NIV)

23 For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 10:9-13 (NIV)

- 9 That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.
- 10 For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved.
- 11 As the Scripture says, "Anyone who trusts in him will never be put to shame."
- 12 For there is no difference between Jew and Gentile--the same Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on him,
- 13 for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Galatians 2:15-16 (NIV)

- 15 "We who are Jews by birth and not 'Gentile sinners'
- 16 know that a man is not justified by observing the law, but by faith in Jesus Christ. So we, too, have put our faith in Christ Jesus that we may be justified by faith in Christ and not by observing the law, because by observing the law no one will be justified.

Galatians 1:8-9 (NIV)

- 8 But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach <u>a gospel other than the one we preached to you, let him be eternally</u> condemned!
- 9 As we have already said, so now I say again: If anybody is <u>preaching to you a gospel other than what you accepted, let him be eternally condemned!</u>

- 32 God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of the fact.

1 Corinthians 15:12-19 (NIV)

- 12 But if it is preached that Christ has been raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead?
- 13 If there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised.
- 14 And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith.
- 15 More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised.

- 13 Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John.
- 14 But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?"
- 15 Jesus replied, "Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness." Then John consented.
- 16 As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water..."

Matthew 28:18-20 (NIV)

- 18 Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.
- 19 Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, <u>baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit</u>,
- 20 and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Acts 2:36-38 (NIV)

- 36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ."
- 37 When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?"
- 38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Acts 8:34-39 (NIV)

- 34 The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?"
- 35 Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus.
- 36 As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. Why shouldn't I be baptized?"
- 38 And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him.
- 39 When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord suddenly took Philip away, and the eunuch did not see him again, but went on his way rejoicing.

Acts 16:29-33 (NIV)

- 29 The jailer called for lights, rushed in and fell trembling before Paul and Silas.
- 30 He then brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"
- 31 They replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved--you and your household."
- 32 Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all the others in his house.
- 33 At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds; then immediately he and all his family were baptized.

Romans 6:1-5 (NIV)

- 1 What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase?
- 2 By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer?
- 3 Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?
- 4 We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.
- 5 If we have been united with him like this in his death, we will certainly also be united with him in his resurrection.

Southern Baptist Faith & Message Article VII: "Baptism and the Lord's Supper"

Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Saviour, the believer's death to sin, the burial of the old life, and the resurrection to walk in newness of life in Christ Jesus. It is a testimony to his faith in the final resurrection of the dead. Being a church ordinance, it is prerequisite to the privileges of church membership and to the Lord's Supper.

The Lord's Supper is a symbolic act of obedience whereby members of the church, through partaking of the bread and the fruit of the vine, memorialize the death of the Redeemer and anticipate His second coming.

Matthew 3:13-17; 26:26-30; 28:19-20; Mark 1:9-11; 14:22-26; Luke 3:21-22; 22:19-20; John 3:23; Acts 2:41-42; 8:35-39; 16:30-33; 20:7; Romans 6:3-5; 1 Corinthians 10:16,21; 11:23-29; Colossians 2:12.

- 25 They exchanged the truth of God for a lie, and worshiped and served created things rather than the Creator--who is forever praised. Amen.

1Corinthians 6:9-10 "Do you not know that the WICKED will NOT INHERIT the kingdom of God? DO NOT BE DECEIVED: Neither the SEXUALLY IMMORAL nor idolaters nor adulterers nor male prostitutes nor <u>HOMOSEXUAL</u> <u>OFFENDERS</u>...will inherit the kingdom of God. And that is what some of you WERE. <u>But you were WASHED</u>, you were <u>SANCTIFIED</u>, you were <u>JUSTIFIED</u> in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the <u>Spirit of our God</u>."

Revelation 21:8 "But the cowardly, the unbelieving, the VILE, the murderers, the SEXUALLY IMMORAL, those who practice magic arts, the idolaters, and all liars—their place will BE IN THE LAKE OF BURNING SULFUR. This is the second death."

Of the increase of His government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over His kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and forever. The zeal of the Lord Almighty will accomplish this."

But many who are first will be last, and many who are last will be first."

Matthew 5:31-32 (NIV)

- 31 "It has been said, 'Anyone who divorces his wife must give her a certificate of divorce.'
- 32 But I tell you that <u>anyone who divorces his wife, except for marital unfaithfulness, causes her to become an adulteress, and anyone who marries the divorced woman commits adultery.</u>

Matthew 19:3-9 (NIV)

- 3 Some Pharisees came to him to test Jesus. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any and every reason?"
- 4 "Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,'
- 5 and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'?
- 6 So they are no longer two, but one. Therefore what God has joined together, let man not separate."
- 7 "Why then," they asked, "did Moses command that a man give his wife a certificate of divorce and send her away?"
- 8 Jesus replied, "Moses permitted you to divorce your wives because your hearts were hard. But it was not this way from the beginning.
- 9 I tell you that anyone who divorces his wife, except for marital unfaithfulness, and marries another woman commits adultery."

Mark 10:2-12 (NIV)

- 2 Some Pharisees came and tested him by asking, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?"
- 3 "What did Moses command you?" he replied.
- 4 They said, "Moses permitted a man to write a certificate of divorce and send her away."
- 5 "It was because your hearts were hard that Moses wrote you this law," Jesus replied.
- 6 "But at the beginning of creation God 'made them male and female.'
- 7 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife,
- 8 and the two will become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one.
- 9 Therefore what God has joined together, let man not separate."
- 10 When they were in the house again, the disciples asked Jesus about this.
- 11 He answered, "Anyone who divorces his wife and marries another woman commits adultery against her.
- 12 And if she divorces her husband and marries another man, she commits adultery."

1 Corinthians 7:10-11 (NIV)

- 10 To the married I give this command (not I, but the Lord): A wife must not separate from her husband.
- 11 But if she does, she must remain unmarried or else be reconciled to her husband. And a husband must not divorce his wife.

1 Corinthians 7:12-16 (NIV)

- 12 To the rest I say this (I, not the Lord): If any brother has a wife who is not a believer and she is willing to live with him, <u>he</u> <u>must not divorce her.</u>
- 13 And if a woman has a husband who is not a believer and he is willing to live with her, she must not divorce him.
- 14 For the unbelieving husband has been sanctified through his wife, and the unbelieving wife has been sanctified through her believing husband. Otherwise your children would be unclean, but as it is, they are holy.
- 15 <u>But if the unbeliever leaves, let him do so.</u> A believing man or woman is not bound in such circumstances; God has called us to live in peace.
- 16 How do you know, wife, whether you will save your husband? Or, how do you know, husband, whether you will save your wife?

22. I know my spiritual gifts that were given to me by God after I was saved.

Romans 12:4-8 (NIV)

- 4 Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function,
- 5 so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.
- 6 We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith.
- 7 If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach;
- 8 if it is encouraging, let him encourage; if it is contributing to the needs of others, let him give generously; if it is leadership, let him govern diligently; if it is showing mercy, let him do it cheerfully.
- 1 Corinthians 12:1-11 (NIV)
- 1 Now about spiritual gifts, brothers, I do not want you to be ignorant.
- 2 You know that when you were pagans, somehow or other you were influenced and led astray to mute idols.
- 3 Therefore I tell you that no one who is speaking by the Spirit of God says, "Jesus be cursed," and no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit.
- 4 There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit.
- 5 There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord.
- 6 There are different kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in all men.
- 7 Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.
- 8 To one there is given through the Spirit the message of wisdom, to another the message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit,
- 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit,
- 10 to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues.
- 11 All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he gives them to each one, just as he determines.

1 Corinthians 14:12 (NIV)

12 So it is with you. Since you are eager to have spiritual gifts, try to excel in gifts that build up the church.

Ephesians 4:8-13 (NIV)

- 8 This is why it says: "When he ascended on high, he led captives in his train and gave gifts to men."
- 9 (What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions?
- 10 He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.)
- 11 It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers,
- 12 to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up
- 13 until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

1 Peter 4:10-11 (NIV)

- 10 Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms.
- 11 If anyone speaks, he should do it as one speaking the very words of God. If anyone serves, he should do it with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen.

1 Corinthians 2:12-14 (NIV)

- 12 We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit who is from God, that we may understand what God has freely given us.

Luke 9:23 (NIV)

23 Then Jesus said to them all: "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

John 16:33 (NIV)

33 "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. <u>In this world you will have trouble</u>. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

2 Timothy 3:12 (NIV)

12 In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted,

Romans 5:1-5 (NIV)

- 1 Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,
- 2 through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we rejoice in the hope of the glory of God.
- 3 Not only so, but we also rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance;
- 4 perseverance, character; and character, hope.
- 5 And hope does not disappoint us, because God has poured out his love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom he has given us.

James 1:2-4 (NIV)

- 2 Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds,
- 3 because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance.
- 4 Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

Philippians 1:29-30 (NIV)

- 29 For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for him,
- 30 since you are going through the same struggle you saw I had, and now hear that I still have.
- 1 Thessalonians 3:2-4 (NIV)
- 2 We sent Timothy, who is our brother and God's fellow worker in spreading the gospel of Christ, to strengthen and encourage you in your faith,
- 3 so that no one would be unsettled by these trials. You know quite well that we were destined for them.
- 4 In fact, when we were with you, we kept telling you that we would be persecuted. And it turned out that way, as you well know.
- 2 Thessalonians 1:3-7 (NIV)
- 3 We ought always to thank God for you, brothers, and rightly so, because your faith is growing more and more, and the love every one of you has for each other is increasing.
- 4 Therefore, among God's churches we boast about your perseverance and faith in all the persecutions and trials you are enduring.
- 5 All this is evidence that God's judgment is right, and as a result you will be counted worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are suffering.
- 6 God is just: He will pay back trouble to those who trouble you
- 7 and give relief to you who are troubled, and to us as well. This will happen when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven in blazing fire with his powerful angels.
